#### The Vicar Writes

Over the past 10 years, we have been looking at Reordering St Denys' Church to make the building more flexible for a wide range of services and community uses. Central to that is the need to install toilets and a kitchen facility!

With the increase in population in our village expected over the coming years, and as yet, no plans within the current proposals to create any additional 'gathering' space for villagers for inside events, the need to adapt St Denys for wider community use has increased.

On top of this, our Messy Church congregation, which has been meeting for just over a year in the Village Hall, has grown to around 85 adults and children attending each month, and 184 adults and children have attending over the year. We therefore need additional room as this church congregation grows!

Therefore, during the **Festival Weekend**, 17/18 June, I shall be giving four x 15 minute presentations in church of the exciting plans to reorder St Denys church. There will be 'before' and 'after' pictures to help you visualise the new space and flexibility, and how St Denys will be reordered to continue to be at the 'Heart of the church's ministry and the Heart of community life' as it has for around 900 years!

The presentations will be from 2.15-2.30pm and 5.10 – 5.25pm on Saturday 17<sup>th,</sup> and at 3-3.15pm and 4.30-4.45pm on Sunday 18, just before the Songs of Praise on the Green.

Do pop in and see how we hope to adapt your village church to continue to meet the growing needs of your village. An A4 brochure on the reordering plans will soon be available for every household in the village. Kind regards Paul

## June - Stanford Pre-school News

Our topic this term has been Water. The children have been learning about floating and sinking, water safety and about how we use water in our everyday lives and thinking about people who do not have access to clean water. They have enjoyed learning about the lifecycle of tadpoles and frogs.
