Vicar writes

As I write this piece for the May newsletter, I have just returned home having had a successful full hip replacement.

I shall be off for the next six weeks at least, and gradually building up my walking and exercises. I am deeply grateful to so many villagers who have messaged me whilst in hospital, and sent cards to await my arrival home, assuring me of their thoughts and prayers. These messages have been deeply appreciated and apologies if I've not been able to reply personally as there have been so many.

I'm sure like you, I was deeply moved by the funeral of Prince Phillip, the Duke of Edinburgh at Windsor Castle last month. It seems very strange to think of the royal family without him being present, as for so long, he has been at the Queen's side and serving the nation in so many ways. So many people with personal experience of him have paid wonderful tributes, especially of the many charities he either started or was involved in. He was certainly an innovator, and encourager, a prodder for action where needed, and above all, a huge support for Her Majesty the Queen in all the work that she has done over decades to serve our nation.

It was a great shame that the nation could not publicly take part in active morning in some way due to the Covid restrictions. However, next year, 2022, is the Queen's Platinum anniversary in June, and early thoughts are underway as to how we might celebrate this as a village. I'm sure that as we do so, we will have in our minds the role that Prince Phillip played in such a successful servant ministry that her Majesty has given to our nation.

The funeral itself was so reminiscent of so many funerals over this past year which have been



limited a number due to Covid restrictions: a widow sat on her own with family unable to comfort, and I know for many people that I have had messages from, they found a special bond with the Royal family over that service. The funeral they could relate too so much. It was almost as if that national event was able to have transfer onto it so much of the grief of the nation over this past year and of course, the tragic thousands of people who have died of Covid.

As I write, the Spring weather has turned for the better and it has been delightful to hear the children on their way home from school headed for the park, enjoying themselves with friends again.

It does seem that finally, things are starting to change. Businesses are opening and hopefully, over the next couple of months, we will start to get back to a 'new normal' - whatever that will be.

I just wanted to say that throughout this time, we as a Church have continued to serve the village through pastoral care and one-to-one support of villagers, and we continue to do so.

Our main service at 10:15am on Sunday at St Denys is open to anyone to attend. It is Covid compliant, and it may well be that after the events of the past year, you would value a calm 60 minutes each week to come to church and just sit and be, and just to allow of the words of the service to wash over you. To re-centre you amongst all the anxiety and stress that you have faced in recent months.

As I look back over the last year, I am so conscious of the way the village has pulled together and supported each other. I'm immensely proud to be vicar of a parish where there are so many people who look out for others. I am sure now that we are aiming to start gathering again, we will be able to increase that sense of contact and community development, and I'm also sure that as a village, we will have been brought even closer together through this pandemic, and the village will be a friendlier and even more supportive community.

After over a year of struggling with arthritic hip and sciatic issues, I am greatly looking forward over the course of this year to getting back to full public ministry as your vicar, and being out and about in the community again, taking services, baptisms, weddings and funerals and to be fully

engaged again in our wonderful primary school and preschool.

Progress after a hip replacement is always gradual, but I am really looking forward to being back amongst you and thank you again for your thoughts and prayers, especially over recent months.
