Vicar Writes

I write this piece just hours after The Queen has been laid to rest in the crypt of St George's Chapel, Windsor.

Today's service and events were moving, and I hope, primarily, enabled in some way, the Royal Family to grieve a little more - despite the fact they do it in the glare of the media.

Millions of words have been said about the Queen in recent days, and in my two sermons in church, and my school collective worship I hope, helped to put her life in the context of her faith. By now, probably more words are not helpful - we all need time to reflect.

But I think a story about Queen Victoria might be appropriate today as the Queen's symbols of office were left on the St George's High Table.

One of the chaplains of the late Queen Victoria had been preaching on the Second Coming of Jesus at Sandringham. Afterwards, in conversation with the preacher, the Queen exclaimed: "Oh! how I wish that the Lord would come in my lifetime!"

" Why," asked the chaplain, " does your Majesty feel this very earnest desire?

The Queen replied with quivering lips, and her whole countenance lighted up by deep emotion- "I should so love to lay my crown at His feet."

I think our late Queen felt the same way as a Christian who felt announced by God to serve. And now, she and the Duke of Edinburgh are in God's nearer presence, awaiting that Second Coming. Then because of their faith in Jesus, both are assured eternity in heaven.
