We have been preparing to sew our purses in DT over the last few weeks and finished them off on Friday, we've learned lots of new skills! Year Four - We have been making Anglo-Saxon houses this week, using cardboard, lollypop sticks, paint and straw. We have worked really well as a team and persevered. In Maths we have been focusing on column addition with exchanging and are really enjoy playing Bubble Multiples to improve our times tables. In gymnastics we are focusing on our balancing skills as well as creating some sequences.
