But with the usual goodwill and compassion we always find in the village, I am confident that together, we can support those most in need. FARINGDON & DISTRICT U3A MEETING ON THURSDAY 8TH DECEMBER

Anne -Marie Prestidge will talk about the Samaritans at our December meeting in the Corn Exchange starting at 2.30pm. Anne-Marie has been a listening volunteer with

the Samaritans for 18 years. Her talk will cover how and why the Reverend Chad Varah founded the organisation in 1953, and how it has evolved into the 24/7 service it is today. It is a common misconception that the Samaritans was set up only to support people who had decided to end their lives prematurely. The organisation is much more than this and Anne-Marie will present some surprising statistics relating to the demographics of the incidents of suicide and the reasons why people reach the point where they believe that this is their only option. She will also discuss what it takes to become a volunteer, the personal qualities that a potential volunteer should possess, and how they are trained to uphold the ethos of the organisation.

After this fascinating talk refreshments will be available to everyone, but non-members are required to pay £1.50 as a contribution.

Foundation - We have been learning about different celebrations such as Bonfire night and Diwali, focusing on fireworks and fire safety. We have also been doing lots of printing and mark making as well as beginning learning our Phonics sounds, some of us have also started learning to read!

Year One - We went on our very own bear hunt to Badbury clump, where we made dens, acted out the story and found a bear! It was lots of fun! We have also been learning different number sentences in maths and practicing our throwing skills with bean bags in PE.

Year Two - We went on a trip to the church to help us answer our question, 'How is St Denys important to the history of the village?' We have also been learning about WW1 and WW2 in history. In PE we have been working hard on our catching skills, aiming to achieve bronze, silver and gold, catching whilst moving.

Year Three - We are busy thinking about some big questions in Year 3. In Geography, whether we would rather live in Oxfordshire or Normandy and in RE, whether light is a good symbol for celebration. We have also been having fun playing handball in PE and improving our throwing and catching skills whilst moving. We have also began practicing our Christmas play which we are excited to show our parents!

Year Four - We have begun learning about electricity in Year 4, we have explored snap circuits and looked at what things in our school and at home use electricity to work. We have also been looking at the story 'Until I Met Dudley' where we came up with our own inventions and have been learning how various items work such as a vacuum cleaner, toaster and a bin lorry. Year Five - In English we have begun reading 'Cosmic Boy' which is about a very tall boy called Liam who wins a competition to go to a theme park in China, we are excited to find out what happens to him. In DT we have been exploring gears on bikes as well as making our own using cardboard and paper.

Year Six - We had an amazing residential to PGL. It was great fun and the food was especially good, particularly the tuna pasta bake and meatballs! We also took part in many activities, a couple of our favourites were the climbing wall and the giant swing! Some of us were a bit scared of heights but overcome our fears and had fun! Back in school we have being learning BID maths and looking at grouping animals in Science.
