Be a life saver in Stanford

Stanford has had a Community First Responder (CFR) team for about 15 years. Currently, there are just two of us and we are looking for more villagers to join the team.

CFRs are volunteers who are trained by the ambulance service to provide essential life-saving treatment and support during those crucial minutes before an ambulance crew arrives. This includes treating patients of all ages suffering a life-threatening emergency such as cardiac arrest, heart attack, chest pain, breathing difficulties or a stroke. Because CFRs only respond to emergencies in the area where they live or work, they can arrive at the scene before an ambulance gets there. In this way, they are able to start life-saving medical treatment earlier.

So, if you want to make a life-saving difference in Stanford and the surrounding area, why not find out how to become a CFR.

Gardening Tips for April

- Sow hardy annuals, such as love-in-a-mist and pot marigolds, as well as native wildflowers into gaps in borders.
- Protect the new shoots of hostas, delphiniums, lupins etc from slugs and snails.
- Continue deadheading spring bulbs and bedding, so that they don't waste energy setting seed.
- Sow sweet peas in their flowering position and/or transplant those sown in the autumn.
- Reinvigorate mature clumps of hardy perennials by dividing and replanting.
- Check for aphids on roses and rub them off before they can multiply.

STEAM Week

The week beginning 13th March was STEAM week, as a school we participated in lessons focusing on the 5 areas of STEAM - Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Maths. We have been designing spaghetti structures, experimental paper cities, baking, planting seeds, designing and making games with magnets, exploring edible slime, making bubbles and catapults! Foundation

This term Foundation have been thinking about 'What grows in our garden?', they have been reading Jack and the Beanstalk, planted their very own beanstalks and bulbs, created scarecrow collages and have been playing florists in the role play corner.

Year 1

Year 1 have been reading 'Zog' and learning about his adventures to dragon school and learning to fly. They have been busy in maths, learning their number bonds to 20 and using number tracks to help them. They are also thoroughly enjoying swimming!

Year 2

In English we have been reading the story of 'The Magic Door' and have been creating our own versions of the story, it has been really fun! We have also been learning about different lengths in maths, mm, cm and metres. We are really enjoying PE, working as a team and completing challenging circuits!

Year 3

This term we have been discussing how successful the Romans were at invading Britain. We are also reading the Enchanted Wood and learnt about Boudicca. We

have been very busy in Art, learning how to block and mono print as well as exploring mosaics.

Year 4

We have been learning about where our food really comes from and why it is important to eat seasonal foods. We have learnt a lot about the digestive system, our teeth and the Eatwell plate. In English we have been writing character descriptions and improving our editing skills.

Year 5

We have been doing lots of investigating in Science, looking at whether all changes are reversible, properties of materials and dissolving. We have also been tasting and baking our own bread in DT! We are working hard in maths, learning all about fractions and multiplying them by an integer.

Year 6

In English we have written our own guides to surviving some crazy houses! We have been learning all about angles in maths, creating clay pots in art and learning lots of skills in volleyball. We have loved having the chance to take over the radio station this term, playing songs and updating everyone on the latest news and sport!
