FINALLY, May is upon us and the Winter is behind us!

Just two things I'd like to bring to your attention this month:

The **Stanford Village Festival**, organised by St Denys Church for the benefit of the whole village, this year shall be on **July**, **I & 2**.

The change of date is to enable more people to take part in a wide variety of activities/and offer help, after many people told us that Father's Day Festival weekend meant that they were not available, as they wanted to be with their fathers — totally understandable.

A prime focus for us all now is the Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III on 6 May 2023. Along with bell ringers across the country, we will be making sure that the church bells are ringing to mark the occasion.

We are sure that you will recall hearing the church bells last September when we rang to mark the death of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and to mark her funeral. On those occasions the bells were 'half-muffled' in order to give a more sombre sound, suitable for the sad events. For the coronation, they will of course be rung loud and clear.

Regular Stanford ringers were pleased to be joined for the commemorative ringing last September by some of our regular ringing visitors, as well as by some ringers who had been 'retired' for some – or many – years. It was great to see them then as well as subsequently and we look forward to seeing them – and potentially more 'retired' ringers - for the coronation.

Alternative Fuel Payment HOPE THIS HELPS ANYONE IN THE VILLAGE WHO ISN'T AWARE

Important - please read if you use oil (or alternative fuels to heat your home) If you use alternative fuel (oil, bottled gas etc) you are entitled to claim alternative fuel payment IN ADDITION to the £400 payment received from your energy company. The payment should have been made automatically (£200) but many who use oil to heat their homes may not know or have not received the payment. You need a recent bill (Sept 22 onwards) showing you've paid more than £200 for oil, bottled gas etc The link below is the claim link for the gov website your claim is directed to the local council who make the payment to your bank account.

- Watch out for late frosts and protect tender plants.
- Earth up potatoes and make late planting.
- Plant out summer bedding when risk of frost has passed.
- Regularly hoe off weeds.
- Mow lawns weekly but consider leaving area uncut for wildlife.
- Lift and divide overcrowded spring bulbs.
- Watch out for Viburnum Beetle and Lily Beetle grub
