Vicars Write

STANFORD FESTIVAL – 1 & 2 JULY 2023

Dear Parishioner, enclosed with this Parish Newsletter is a **Poster** for the **Stanford Festival**, which this year, takes place over **Saturday 1 & Sunday 2 July**. Please can you put it **up in your window**, so the word gets out? In particular, if you have neighbours who are new to the village, please introduce the Festival to them and bring them along!

On the reverse side of the poster is a draft of the **Festival Programme** (at the time of going to print), with other events/activities to be added.

This year's theme is 'Royalty', and the Festival starts off at the slightly earlier time of **1pm** with a Procession led by the 'Festival King & Queen' to Church Green, where they shall be crowned, and the Festival officially opened. The Stanford Primary School Choir will then perform an opening contribution. Either meet in the Vicarage front garden by 1250pm for the procession to Church Green or grab a seat on the green.

We have a number of new activities this year, including a **Dog Show**, a **Tug of War**, a **Royal Afternoon Tea**, a four-sided **Climbing Tower** both days, and we are creating **'Zones'** around the church/village hall such as for 'Crafts', 'Food', 'What's On' etc.

In the **Craft Zone** on Saturday afternoon in the Village Hall, we want to promote any small business/sole traders in Stanford, Goosey or Hatford (the Parish) making arts and crafts, and in the centre of the hall, we hope to provide an opportunity for you to try out a craft and may be introduced to a new hobby?

There will also be a **'What's On'** zone in church on Sunday afternoon. An opportunity for all the various



village organisations to promote what they offer/need help for. We'd love to promote all our great village offers, so don't forget to drop in and have a chat – and maybe sign up for a new club/activity this autumn?

As ever, the overall vision is to bring the whole village together. St Denys Church organises the Festival each year with the aim of helping villagers to get to know each other, to welcome new-comers and of course, to raise funds for the church and various charities/organisations.

Like all years, **we do need lots of help!** Help with setting up the Church Green and Village Hall and packing away – which Dan Huby has kindly offered to coordinate. And generally, to staff a stall/activity for an hour or two on either/both afternoon. If we had dozens of villagers willing to do just 1 or 2 hours, it would really share the load, and everyone would get to enjoy both days.

We shall produce the **final Festival Programme** in the week running up to the festival. These will be available via the COOP, Stanford Coffee Shop, School, Pre-School, Church Welcome Desk, Village Hall, Horse & Jockey and online. We also have a **Stanford Festival Facebook Page** to provide up to date news, including how you can register for the Dog Show, Tug of War etc.

Well, we did it – a group of 14 of us met at the church tower at 10am on Coronation Day, 6^{th} May, and, in groups of 8, rang all 8 of the church bells until 11am – which was when the coronation service started at

Westminster Abbey in London. We hope that you heard at least some of our ringing. Well done and thank you to all of the ringers.

The weight of Stanford's individual bells vary from 3cwt (the lightest at 165kg) to 8cwt (the heaviest at 426kg). The band of ringers included both males and females with ages spanning from over 80 to the youngest who was only 8; some have been ringing for around 50 years, some only learning since March. Almost anyone can learn to ring!

FARINGDON & DISTRICT U3A MEETING ON 8TH JUNE '23

The June meeting in Faringdon Corn Exchange at 2.30 pm will be about **Oxford's Penicillin.** The speaker is **Marie-Louise Kerr** who is a wonderfully engaging speaker who will talk about the story of the life-saving work carried out in the Dunn School in Oxford along with the trials and tribulations faced by the scientist Alexander Fleming. The drug we use today was developed by a group of scientists based in Oxford.

When Fleming was awarded a Nobel prize in 1945, he shared it with Howard Florey and Ernst Chain. Fleming first observed and name penicillin, but it was Florey and Chain and a group of scientists working in Oxford who developed it into a viable drug.



Marie Louise has the interesting title of Curator without Museum and travels widely giving talks to different groups. The talk is open to all interested members and visitors, but visitors are required to pay £1.50 to attend – and of course, to enjoy the refreshments available after the talk. GARDENING TIPS FOR JUNE

- Continue sowing salad crops, such as beetroot, lettuce, pak choi and radish.
- Sow french and runner beans, peas, squash, sweet corn and outdoor cucumbers directly into prepared beds outside.
- Calabrese, turnips, and kohl rabi can be sown now for an autumn crop.
- Plant vegetables sown indoors earlier in the season, including winter brassicas and sweet peppers.
- Continue training fan-trained fruit trees.
- Thin pears, plums, peaches, nectarines and apricots. Apples should be thinned at the end of the month.
