Gardening Tips for July

- Autumn- flowering bulbs, such as autumn crocuses, Colchicum, Sternbergia, Amaryllis and Nerine can be planted now.
- Cut back Delphiniums and Geraniums after the first flush of flowers to encourage a second flowering period. Feed after cutting back.
- Deadhead flower borders regularly to prolong flowering. Disbud and dead-head
- dahlias if growing for large blooms. Leave roses that produce attractive hips.
- Take cuttings of patio and container plants ready for next year.
- Start collecting seed from plants you want to grow next year, especially annuals such as Calendula, poppies and love-in-a-mist

We started off the term with a wonderful outing to Stanford House gardens. The children and families had a wonderful time pond dipping, meadow sweeping, playing parachute games and finished off by going on a bear hunt. The weather was absolutely perfect, and the children loved the opportunity to spend time enjoying this wonderful natural space.

We have also been growing beans in clear bags on the windows. We have been watching them grow and change and learning all about the different parts. Once they had escaped from the top of their bags the children planted them in soil ready to take home for their dad's on Father's Day.

We will be spending this term helping to prepare those children leaving us in July for school. We will have a school role play area, dressing up with uniforms and we will be making books with pictures of their new classrooms and teachers. We have also invited their teachers to come and visit them here at the Pre-school.

The Pre-school will now keep a permanent box outside of the Pre-school for people to leave donations in for the foodbank. The foodbank is reporting high demand for parcels at the moment and is particularly short of tinned fruit, vegetables and puddings.
