Stanford Church Bell Ringers

We have reported about the ringers and especially about our learners' fantastic progress recently so, maybe this month, it is time to say something about the church bells in Stanford.

There are 8 bells. Before they were installed in the tower at Stanford in 1970, they were in a tower in Oxford, St. Peter in the East, a church building which became redundant before the building became the college library for St Edmund Hall.

Our heaviest bell weighs in at about 8½ cwt (427kg) and was cast in 1700. It is doing well for a 323 year old. The smallest bell weighs about 3½ cwt (166kg) and is a much younger bell - aged only 132 - as it was cast in 1891. The weight of all 8 bells added together is 4719lb – or 2140.5kg. Real heavy metal!

The bells are hung in the 'English style' on wheels so that they can be swung full circle. One person rings one bell so to ring all 8 together, we need at least 8 ringers. The bells are hanging just below the level of the clock face which you can see from church green.
