Sunday 5 November 2023 1015 – A Service of Remembrance & Hope

If you have lost a loved one in recent years, you may find a service we offer a help – especially if you are facing Christmas for the first time without a close relative/friend.

In our 1015am service, we will read out a list of those who have asked us to remember them by name, give an opportunity for family members to come forward and light a candle, and those who mourn shall be remembered in prayers. Appropriate hymns, bible reading, and a short sermon will support the focus. Afterwards, cake and hot drinks shall be served at the back of church. In the past this service has been on a Sunday afternoon, but we are focussing our 1015am service for the wider community this year on Nov 5.

The Vicar Writes

The Vicar Writes - November 2023

NOVEMBER is a month with Remembrance at its heart. As many in the nation stop what they are doing at I I am, on the I Ith day, of the I Ith month, and remember those who gave their lives in the two great wars, and those that followed, so others start to consider how they shall cope with the first Christmas without a loved one.

Sadly, of course, as I write (19OCT), we are still reeling from the images of Hamas' barbaric acts on innocent civilians in southern Israel, and then as the days and weeks follow, we see the effects of war, once again

in this region, and we pray for a cessation of violence, and a just outcome so that both Jews and Muslims can live peacefully, alongside each other.

This year 11/11 falls on a Saturday. So, the School Remembrance service shall be on Friday 10th, then a short Act of Remembrance around the War Memorial on 11/11, and of course, you're most welcome to join our Remembrance Sunday Service at St Denys at 1015am, followed by the two-Minute-Silence at 11am on 12 November. Goosey residents (and others) may also like to attend a 6pm Evening service at All Saints on 12/11, with refreshments starting at 5.15pm - see Church Service panel.

As I said, the first Christmas without a loved one can be especially hard. I am conscious that during the Covid season, many in the parish had to hold very small funeral services for loves ones. In some cases, there were just four of us standing around the grave in Stanford churchyard for a brief, socially distanced service, with no Wake to follow. For those families, as well as for others in the past two years, I thought it might be helpful to hold a service in St Denys where families can gather and remember their loved one, have their name read out, light a candle in their memory and then after, gather with other villagers for cake and hot drinks, and share memories. Sunday 5 November, 1015am, will therefore be a Service of Remembrance and Hope. You, and your family would be most welcome. If you'd like the name of your loved one read out, please email vicar@stdenys.org with the full name of your loved one, the date of death, and your relationship to the deceased, please.

Finally, two other pastoral matters which I hope will help. The **Village Compassion Fund** may be able to help with small grants in cases of real emergency for those struggling with the cost of living. The **application** form can be found at www.stdenys.org. I can also refer people to the **Faringdon Food Bank**, who can provide up to six lots of food for the family/individual etc.

The pressures on family life, finances, health and a myriad of other issues these past four years have put **considerable strain on relationships**. In my pastoral work, couples often express embarrassment at seeking help, but often, being signposted to qualified, practical help outside the parish can really help save a marriage – and thereby, a family. It is **never** too early, or too late to seek help.

In my 10 years here as vicar, I've referred over a dozen couples to counselling and in some cases, the church has covered the costs in an anonymous way. So, if your relationship is under strain, or you think you would benefit from external help, please do contact me in the strictest of confidence. As other parishioners will confirm, I am completely unshockable, and my only goal is to see what might be possible to help **restore**, and then build on the relationships. Many find emailing me in the first instance easiest, so vicar@stdenys.org. We can then arrange a face-to-face meet or, if childcare

is difficult, I often zoom in the evenings. And if you are seeking help alone, do bring someone along with you, or to join in the zoom.

November may well be a month of remembering, and looking back, but **December 3 is the start of Advent**, and a whole new season looking forward, and one in which God can be present, as He was in the person of Jesus.

At Christmas we celebrate Emmanuel – God with us. Whatever you are going through this month, or next, God wants to help. We were never intended to live life apart from God, but in a daily relationship with Him. So as you look back, also look forward as my prayer is whatever the past may have held, your future can be changed if you invite Emmanuel to be a part of your life. I hope to see you at one of the services this month, and/or next!


