Here at Stanford School we have had another busy few weeks leading up to half term!

Foundation have been enjoying learning about so many different events including Chinese New Year. We learnt all about what happens to celebrate the occasion and learnt a wonderful dragon dance and song.

Year One really enjoyed our Victorian school experience afternoon. We were able to dress up in traditional clothing and pretend we were attending a Victorian school, using traditional writing tools and

lessons. We also had a wonderful, muddy trip to Badbury clump.

Year Two have been having a great time learning about fairy tales and creating our own. We particularly enjoyed reading Into the Forest and creating some descriptive writing based on this. It was also great fun to learn all about our favourite places from around the UK.

Year Three have enjoyed making some wonderful Roman inspired mosaic tiles, we experimented with a variety of printing techniques before creating mosaics using geometric shapes and patterns. We have also enjoyed our music this term where we were focussing on reggae music.

Year Six have produced some wonderful nonchronological reports all about dragons to link to our work on evolution. We have also considered how important Darwin's trip to the Galapagos for our understanding of evolution and adaptations.
