However it is not essential to have studied during the early part of the year to make sense of the course which is about to start and we would encourage new members to make a start now. This coming term will lead very naturally into the courses which are planned for next year in **CHRISTIAN DISCIPLESHIP**. But more of this later... The new term starts on Wednesday 4th October. The fee for the 8 weeks is £4. Married couples £6. and we have a few bursaries for any in acute financial situations.
