STRENGTHENING MARRIAGE

Likewise, having given many years of life in focussing on the needs of children, when children finally leave the nest for work or further study, the transition to being back as a couple without children in the home can be difficult.

As a church we are committed to helping marriages. We do this through thorough marriage preparation for those who are to be married in church, through one to one help for individuals and for couples, and through the *Marriage Course* which we run to help couples enrich their relationship. Last month I also had the privilege of meeting a couple in church, first thing in the morning, to pray with them. The day was very special to them as it was their 25th Wedding Anniversary. Centenary Quarter Peal Day

In 1913, the Vale of the White Horse Branch of Church Bell Ringers was formed. The branch is part of the Oxford Diocesan Guild of Church Bell Ringers. As part of the centenary celebrations, ringers attempted to ring a quarter peal at each of the 'ringable' towers in the branch on Saturday 11thMay 2013. A quarter peal involves about 45 minutes of continuous ringing and requires ringers to follow a pattern of changes in the way that the bells change order. Quarter peals were attempted at towers including Stanford in the Vale, Shrivenham, Faringdon, Longcot, Shellingford, Lyford, Coleshill, Hinton Waldrist, Buckland, Buscot and Uffington. The quarter peal at Stanford in the Vale was

completed successfully, taking 45 minutes. We rang 1320 changes of Plain Bob Minor and ringers were Anne E Jones (ringing bell 1), Stephen R Munday (2), Jackie O'Hagan (3), Isobelle O'Hagan (4), Nicola E Pullan (5) and Tony Pullan (ringing the 6 – and Conducting).


