THE VICAR WRITES

September drew to a close, the wonderful run of Village Weddings, and on the 29th, we celebrated Harvest in church. October 5 is our annual **Churchyard Working Party** and I am delighted that this year, staff at the COOP in the village will be joining us as part of their community support project. Do come along from 10am if you can to cut down the Wildlife sections at the end of the season, and to help with the very many jobs we need to do to help maintain the churchyard for the enjoyment of all villagers.

Whilst on the topic of the Churchyard, may I make a special plea to **Dog Owners**. In recent months it has been very noticeable that dogs are being let off their lead in the churchyard and have been soiling headstones and leaving mess on graves etc. I am sure we would all want to pay proper respect to these family graves of former villagers, and would agree that this is not respectful. Please can I therefore ask, like my predecessors have done, that Dog Owners respect the very clear Churchyard signs which ask for dogs to be kept on leads, and, that any soiling is collected and taken away. A Churchyard is a place where the history of our village is recorded and a very special place where families come regularly to visit the graves of their loved ones. I hope that we can all give the resting places of former villagers the respect and dignity that is appropriate. Thank you.

Looking to the future — as I mentioned in my September comment, this month the congregation at St Denys are starting a Mission Action Plan process, looking at where we believe God would have us be in the next five years. As part of that, we would like to invite everyone in the parish to complete the brief **Questionnaire** attached to this newsletter stating what you believe to be the needs of the parish and how the church might help. Collecting points for the questionnaires are to be found in St Denys Church, Stanford Primary School, and at the COOP.

Finally, an advance notice. We would be delighted if you would join us for the annual **Remembrance Sunday Service** at St Denys at 10.15am on Sunday 10 November, where we shall start in church and then proceed to the War Memorial in the churchyard for 11am. In addition, for those in the village on Monday 11 November, do join us at 11am around the War Memorial for a simple Act of Remembrance. Please note this is a <u>change of venue</u> from Millennium Green. Now that the Village has its own War Memorial it was felt more appropriate to gather around it than gather at

the Green. Pupils from Stanford School will also be in attendance.
