The Vicar writes

It's August, and so a huge sigh of relief!

June and July are incredibly busy in Stanford, what with the Festival, School end-of-year events, clubs and associations having their final gatherings before the summer and, talking to many on the school gate, children and parents are equally tired.

Lately, I've been reading an interesting book which shows how our society had developed gadgets to save us time, time which we then fill with even more stuff making our lives even more frenetic and pressured! Certainly over the last few months many people have expressed to me that their work/life/family balance is not good, and that they need to address it. August is a good month to do that. Whether we are fortunate enough to go away for a few days, or we stay at home, hopefully the pace of life slows down and we are able to take stock.

In recent years 'Mindfulness' has become popular both in education and business. At its core is a realisation that we need to enjoy the 'present', rather than rushing into the future, and to *make* and *take time* in our busy lives to stop and pause during the day and to be still. For many of us that

is very difficult and goes against our natural instinct, but does it actually go against the way that we were made by God, our creator? I'd say no.

Christians believe that we were made by, and in the image of God, and intended to have a relationship with him which would sustain and nourish us. This is done through many ways, through worshipping, through reading the Bible, meeting with other Christians, but principally through prayer and simply being quiet and being in God's presence.

In Psalm 46:10, the Psalmist writes: "Be Still and know that I am God", or as The Message version of the Bible puts is: _"Step out of the traffic! Take a long, loving look at me, your High God, above politics, above everything."

Maybe this Autumn we each need to 'step out of the traffic' that we are travelling in, and especially the political chaos that we are in, and in the stillness, to 'take a long, loving look at the God who loves us'. A God who wants to spend time with us, to restore us, to encourage us, to listen to us.

As always, St Denys church will be open each day for villagers to pop in and spend a quiet 5 minutes. May I encourage all of us to pause this August, and to 'be still' - even for a short time, in order that God might restore us and that we might experience something afresh from him.

STANFORD IN THE VALE COMMUNITY BUS

TERMINATION OF SERVICE

The committee regrets to announce that the Community Bus Service will cease to operate at the end of September.

The decision has been taken in view of the withdrawal of our funding from the County Council and the introduction of the new hourly 67 service commencing on 25th July.

The committee is of the opinion that it will not be viable to operate our services alongside

this new, more regular service which will run six days a week. This is funded by Section 106 money from the housing developments and there is a contract in place with Oxfordshire County Council which means that it will continue for at least the next six years.

The committee regret any inconvenience that will be caused, especially to those villages other than Stanford but feels that there is no alternative.
