The Vicar Writes '

This year, St Denys has been developing its support to families in the parish.

Much of this is done quietly, in the background, week in, week out, helping with all sorts of pastoral issues. Other help is more public, and also provide opportunities for families to learn something more about the Christian faith, about God's love, and also to get to know other young families in the village.

At the start of the year the Lee Abbey team worked with us on a number of activities as part of a 5-day outreach. In February, we launched our monthly Messy Church, held on the 4th Sunday of the month at 4pm in the village hall - this now reaches 125 children and parents. Our Scramblers group for parents with babies now attracts around 16, and our J-Team event is as popular as ever.

In the Spring we ran a small, but successful *Parentalk* course for those wanting to have encouragement and gain resources for raising primary school aged children, and this month, we offer another resource, the CAP Money Course which helps us all learn how to budget better and to use our income more wisely. Just one of the tips on that course is to compare shops for your weekly family shop. As a family, we did just that. We are now saving a whopping £40 a week, that's £2,080 a year! So just one of the ideas from the course has already helped us

massively and I am sure other resources and ideas offered will help others.


