The Vicar Writes '

As I wrote this piece for the March Newsletter, Valentine's Day is just hours away. Why do I mention this, because as Vicar, my phone (or Facebook messenger) starts to buzz a few weeks after Christmas and a few weeks after Valentine's Day as couples get engaged and enquire about weddings. It is one of the many happy parts of my role as a vicar.

This year I am taking 9 weddings in the parish, and I already have some bookings in for 2018- and I anticipate more!

One of the things that often surprise couples marrying in one of our three church buildings in the parish, is that I offer them marriage preparation. No, it is not an interrogation, or a 'lay down on the psychiatrist's couch' sort of session. It is, however, a chance for the couples themselves to talk really deeply, and communicate with each other their hopes and dreams about their future lives together.

I offer four resources which couples use privately, together. The first resource is to help them consider what 'baggage' we all bring into any new relationship — good and bad, and how that might impact the new relationship/marriage. The second resource is a fun activity looking at how different we can be, and as such, where the tensions might be in a marriage unless good compromise is made.

The third resource helps couples to understand their 'love language', not just 'telling' someone you love them, but understanding how they 'feel' loved, and so two people don't start drifting apart and 'feeling' unloved. The fourth resource is helping couples understand the depth of the vows they will make to each other, 'for better for worse.... And till death do us part'.

Couples always say how much they have enjoyed it, and how it has helped them — even if they have been living together for years before their wedding day. It is one of the ways we hope to strengthen relationships and marriages in this parish as part of our commitment as a church to serve and care for those in our parish. Often couples who are having a tough time in their marriage also contact me. By using these resources, we can often find a foundational reason for their problem(s) and so, I can often signpost them to appropriate resources to help strengthen their marriage.

So, if you've got engaged recently, are maybe exploring getting married, or may wish for some support in your relationships, as your vicar I am here to help in any way that I can. I'd love to talk to you!
