The Vicar Writes

The death of a child is one of the most painful things parents, families and communities can face, and last month, as a close community, we faced it with the death of Tom Gibbons, aged just 17 in a road accident on the A417. Our prayers and thoughts are with, and will continue to be with, his parents, family and friends.

As I said at Tom's packed funeral at St Denys, on April 14, as a parish, we will commemorate 'Good Friday' when Jesus, God's own son died aged just

33 - in the prime of <u>his</u> life. We will reflect from 1-3pm, in church, on Jesus' last two hours on earth. On that

cross, Jesus – as ever – gave us a model for honest and life-transforming living. Jesus was honest with God. He spoke very few words from the cross – at least those recorded. The first were: *"God, why have you abandoned me?"* In other words: *Why have you let this happen? Why did you not stop it?* And Jesus could have just left it like that. Angry, in pain and bitter.

<u>BUT</u> before he died, Jesus said something else: **"Father: Into your hands I commend my Spirit?"** In other words: *I don't understand, I'm angry and in pain,* but I trust in you, and I trust you to do what is ultimately right.

Christians believe that three days later, 'Good Sunday ', Jesus was raised from the dead and as a result, **DEATH IS DEFEATED**, and new and eternal life has been made possible - for all who believe and trust in Jesus. We shall celebrate that too in St Denys on Easter Sunday – 16^{th} , 10.15am!

It is my prayer that sometime soon, if not this Easter, we will all be able to turn from the very right and proper questions of WHY Tom died so young, and start to be able to say, and mean: *"Into your hands God, I commend Tom's spirit and life, and into your hands God, I commend my life too."*

For I sincerely believe that if we do, we will deeply know the God who not only lost his son, but is now in heaven with His son, for all eternity - and we can be too, because DEATH IS DEFEATED. That, amid the chocolate and cards, is the REAL message of Easter!

April- Stanford Pre-school News

This term our topic has been 'Rhyming Bears'. We have been reading some of our favourite bear stories like 'We're going on a Bear Hunt' and 'Peace at Last' which we turned our role play area into for the children to re-tell the story themselves.
