July - Stanford Pre-school News

This term we are very busy preparing our older children for Primary School! We have been taking small groups of children to visit School and we will soon be welcoming the Foundation teachers to Pre-school. This really helps with the transition process as the children become more familiar with their new teachers and new surroundings.

The children will also be participating in School role play and they will have the chance to create their own 'School Book' which will include photos of their new teachers and their new School together with any thoughts, concerns and the things they are looking forward to about moving up to Primary School. Our younger children will be making 'Pre-school books' which include photos of their key person and of the Pre-school. The children take these books home so that parents are able to share them with their child over the long summer holidays so that come September whether they are starting School or coming back to Pre-school they will find it a breeze!

Later in the term our children will have the fantastic opportunity to participate in the Primary School Sports Day and will enjoy a Leavers Picnic in the park.

With the recent lovely weather the children have spent even more time outside in the garden playing with water.
