#### The Vicar Writes ......

I hope that you and your family had a great Christmas and are looking forward to all that 2018 might bring.

Here at St Denys we are excited about developments this year with, hopefully, the Phase One of the Reordering being started – more about that with the February newsletter.

But as a church we are also keen to focus on *people*, and not just buildings!

As such, our **Messy Church** congregation continues to grow – now 220 adults and children have attended our monthly gathering at 4pm, on the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month in the Village Hall. In addition, this year, we will be offering the following resources to help the community:

**Parent Talk** – two six-session, DVD-based courses for parents looking at parenting children of Primary School and Secondary School ages. These courses are designed by *Care For The Family*, a highly respected charity.

The Marriage Course – a very practical, encouraging course for any couple considering marriage and for those who are and who want to continue to strengthen and deepen their marriage.

Money Management Course – we shall be offering a 3-session evening course through our trained CAP course leaders for anyone who in this new year, wants a helpful structure to manage and budget their money more effectively.

**Start Course** – an opportunity to explore where you are at in life, what you believe about God and faith in a non-threatening environment over 5 sessions in a local home.

Details of all these resources, and more, will be included in a new **Church Website** we are developing, which will soon be able to be found by logging on to **www.stdenys.org.** We will also soon be launching our own **Facebook** group to help keep people up to date.

#### <u>December Parish Newsletter - Stanford</u> Pre-school News

We began our term talking about two very different events in the calendar; Diwali, the Hindu Festival of Light and Bonfire Night. This meant that the children have had the

opportunity to create some fabulous works of art; colouring in beautiful Rangoli patterns and creating some fantastic firework pictures using brightly coloured paints on black paper. We spoke about celebrations and the children loved creating their own birthday party in the mud kitchen, making mud cakes and topping with candles and writing party invitations.

We have been learning about shapes and finding them in our environment, singing songs to help the children remember the different properties and making arrangements and patterns with them.

The children have been enjoying learning about similarities and differences. We have been discussing their families and how they are similar and different from their friends. They have been painting self-portraits and making faces using buttons and wool.

Our next focus is of course Christmas! The children have been making salt dough decorations and Christmas cards and practicing our songs ready for the Christmas performance at the Church.

Foundation have been taking a stroll through the deep, dark words and exploring Julia

Donaldson's books: The Gruffalo, The Gruffalo's Child and Stick Man. They had a great time at Badbury Clumps hunting for Stick Man

Year 1 have been learning all about bears. They have studied maps to see where they live and have designed and made coats for Barnaby Bear to wear. They even had a special Teddy Bears' Picnic at Forest School, it was lots of fun!

**Year 2** have been exploring the jungle through writing non-chronological reports. We have also looked at block graphs and pictograms about what our favourite jungle animal is.

Year 3 had an amazing time at the Living Rainforest in Newbury where they learnt how plants and animals adapted to their environment. They have also made mud maids in DT to help us visualise our story of the Lost Gardens of Heligan.

Year 4 have been learning about the migrations of different animals. We found out how the Arctic Tern flies from the Arctic to Antarctica and back every year. We then went on to write our own reports about the migration of the Northern Elephant Seal, an incredible creature.

**Year 5** have been learning all about Ancient Egypt including the physical geography and the way in which the Ancient Egyptians lived.

**Year 6** have been learning about radar and how it identified where the Germans were as part of their WW2 topic. They have also learnt about some of the key places in WW2 including Dunkirk, London and Berlin.
