### **Vicar Writes**

This month we celebrate 70 years of Her Majesty's service to this nation, and to God, as our Queen.

Across the world, she is admired and respected. Closer to home, she has seen 14 prime ministers come and go. She has been at the very centre of our nation's life, with detailed knowledge of all the major events we've been through and, as many of those prime ministers have said, her wisdom and counsel have been invaluable.

This is not the time, nor the place to discuss the monarchy, but I think most commentators agree that under her, with change in every other institution, it is probably down to the love and respect with which our Queen is held that the monarchy has survived many major crises – including the two latest family ones.

Prime ministers have come and gone, as have events, but somehow, Queen Elizabeth has offered a steady, calm, gentle but purposeful leadership and stability. How has she done that?

I'd like to suggest the key resource for her has been her faith in Jesus Christ. Viewers of her annual Christmas broadcasts will know that on every occasion, she has used these few minutes to offer hope, and never fails to mention how vital her faith is to her. However much our nation might be blown around by culture and world events, the solid rock of her faith in Jesus Christ is an anchor.

Through recent years, with the Duke's death, her son's court case, the move of Prince Harry and his young family across the pond, and her own failing health at the age of 95, faith has been the constant.

So as a church at St Denys, over the Platinum celebration Weekend, we shall focus our Sunday Service on the topic 'Women of Faith'. Every first Sunday of the month since may, we've been looking at key women in the Bible who have been used by God. On June 5 we shall do the same, but update it with references and resources the Queen has used to sustain her faith, and to give her peace in a world of charge these past 70 years.

- Check plants daily and water them if the soil is dry — especially newly planted fruit trees and shrubs
- Harden off any remaining half-hardy bedding plants ready for planting out.
- Use blinds or apply shade paint to prevent your greenhouse from overheating. Remember to open vents and doors on warm days.
- Keep on top of weeding. Your plants shouldn't have to compete for precious water, light, and nutrients
