Vicar Writes

Dear Villagers

Stanford Village Compassion Fund

Every day we read of inflation going up and every day, it seems our petrol/diesel costs are rising – let alone our utility bills!

As vicar, I am very conscious that despite whatever Government financial help may, or may not be offered in the coming months, there will be villagers who are really struggling financially. I am already hearing of families who have decided they cannot afford meat for their evening meal, and also, a few villagers who are not attending hospital appointments as they could not afford public transport, or to make an donation to our volunteer Village Taxi Scheme to hospital etc.

So, this month I want to share a few things and, that as ever, I hope our village shall rally round to support those in need.

Firstly, as a church, we are launching a Stanford Village Compassion Fund, into which people can make small donations, such as £1 or £2 per month via a Standing Order, or a one-off gift. This Fund will then allow me, in consultation with our Church Wardens, to make one off strategic emergency grants to individuals in urgent need. The Fund is not meant to be a permanent source of help, but a one-off help to an individual, or a family. We will soon be making some publicity available, but if you wish to donate, simply send your donation via BACS to: Lloyds Bank, Account: Stanford PCC St Denys Church, Account No: 00109758, and Sort Code: 30.93.18 . Please add: Village Compassion Fund, or VCP. We will ONLY use these funds for this purpose, and not for another church purpose. St Denys is a charity, so if you are a taxpayer, please let us know and we can send you a Gift Aid form, increasing your gift by 25%. Thank you.

Secondly, we wish to make widely available the details of groups, charities etc which can provide more long-term advice and help with things such as money/budget planning, cooking on a budget, managing debt etc. Quick signposting of people to the right support will be vital.



Thirdly, as many will know, the Church co-ordinates a Volunteer Taxi Scheme (Margorie Gooding 710656), where for a small donation (£5 Return to Wantage/Faringdon Surgery, or £10 to Oxford or Swindon Hospitals), volunteers will take you to the appointments. If you have an appointment and cannot afford such a donation, just let me know and the VCF will cover the donation for petrol/diesel direct. I do not want ANY villager missing a medical or other professional appointment due to finance.

Fourthly, I am in talks with the **Faringdon Food Bank** as to how we might support them further as a village in terms of donating goods at the COOP and, how we might use Vouchers so that our villagers in need can access their help. I'll keep you posted.

It is clear that the coming year will not be easy for many, financially, but we as a church community will do all we can to support pastorally and practically, and I am confident that as a village, we shall pull together and support those in need.

I will soon set out the **Grant Criteria** for making strategic grants to those in need, and where people can access Grant Application forms, but for now, if you can help with a one-off gift or, set up a standing order, even for £1 a month, it will all help and with multiples, it will soon build up.

Each month at the bottom of my Vicar letter I will let you know much has been received, and how much has been given out in Grant (obviously no names). Only myself and our church treasurer shall know the names of those who apply, and are given money, so that hopefully, people will come forward when they need help and not be embarrassed. Confidentiality is guaranteed. Thank you all. Yours *Paul*

Webbing caterpillars

At this time of year many of the local hedgerows and trees are covered in silky webs created by caterpillars to deter birds.

This year, webs are widespread in the Parish, largely affecting hawthorn trees and hedges as well as a few saplings in the Community Woodland. These have been checked and are not hairy. They are likely to be harmless ermine moth caterpillars, commonly found on hawthorn, blackthorn, wild cherry, bird cherry, willows and apples. The caterpillars should be gone by end of June/July, and the affected trees and hedges should recover.

Although these webs are unsightly, they are harmless, but it is always advisable to keep away from affected hedges and trees. Also, it is worth restating general advice not to touch, or allow your dogs or children to touch, any hairy caterpillars or their webs, as the hairs can be toxic.
