Dear Parishioner

Help with Cost Of Living

Last month, I mentioned my vision of creating a **Village Compassion Fund**, where villagers pay in, say, £2 per month via standing order, so that Emergency Grants can be made to individuals/families in great need as we all face fuel and cost of living increases. I am delighted to say that at the time of going to press, already nearly £600 has been raised, I am about to apply to the Public Purposes Charity, and another local Trust has been in touch to encourage me to apply for a grant.

All donations will be held in a Restricted Account, so the Fund can only be used for the Village Compassion Fund, and not for any church-related expenditure. As a charity, we can reclaim Gift Aid, so do ask for a Form.

In addition I have held discussions with the **Faringdon Food Bank**. As from September, I and the Headteacher of the Primary School, and the Manager of the Pre-School, will be able to **refer people** to them. They will be initially assessed and then offered up to 6 food parcels to help.

Thirdly, through working with the Faringdon Food Bank and other agencies, I am hoping to provide an **information leaflet** giving all sorts of groups/organisations who can help with things like debt, how to make sure you are receiving all the right Benefits etc. So, in the past month there has been some progress, and I am very much hoping that over the coming month, we will be able to increase donations to the Fund, and also to the Faringdon Food bank via the bin in the COOP. As we will now be recipients of the Food Bank, it



would be good if we, as a village, could increase our donations via the COOP?

I will write more in the September newsletter on the Application process for Grants, but on the meantime, if you can make a donation of money, or goods to the Food Bank, that will be great.

- Keep dead-heading flowers to encourage more blooms.
- Water Containers and new plants, preferably with "grey", recycled water or stored rainwater.
- Collect seed from garden plants to propagate for next season.
- Harvest sweetcorn and other vegetables as they become ready.
- Continue cutting out old, fruited canes on raspberries and loganberries.

We got to hold lots of different animals that Mrs Matthew's kindly brought in. We particularly liked holding the snake and gecko. As part of our topic, we have created our own trojan horses.

Year Six We have been really busy working on our end of year musical 'Olivia.' We have all enjoyed practising, performing and developing our acting and singing skills. If you think you have a steady hand you ought to try out the wire loop games we created. We also had a great trip to the Air Tattoo, as a well done for all our hard work this year.
