Gardening Tips for June

- Plant up Hanging Baskets.
- Plant out summer bedding.
- Pinch out side shoots of indeterminate tomatoes and feed regularly.
- Continue sowing salad crops, such as beetroot, lettuce, pak choi and radish
- Sow french and runner beans, peas, squash, sweetcorn and outdoor cucumbers into prepared beds.
- Calabrese, turnips and kohl rabi can be sown in June for an autumn crop.
