The Vicar writes

AS I write this message, the Stanford Festival has just finished, and hundreds of villagers, old and new, have enjoyed two days of gathering, entertainment and fun.

Each year, St Denys Church hosts the event to unite the village, and to provide an opportunity (on the Sunday) for village organisations to have a stall to raise their profile and, to raise much needed funds.

This year, we were extremely grateful to our main sponsors (as of the time of writing) the Public Purposes Charity, Earthline, Horse & Jockey, Honest Solar, Aramaza, AHS Painters & Property Services, Gary Does Solar, Cobra Concrete, J Godfrey & Sons and the Stanford Social Club. Their contributions helped to cover the costs of buying in entertainment, printing costs, village hall costs, insurance and many other things necessary to make the event a success. We thank each one of them most sincerely.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank my colleagues on the Festival Task Group who worked so hard all year round to get things ready, and then oversee the practical details over the weekend. My thanks to Karin Williams-Cuss, Karen Boyle Dan Huby and Neil Mantle.

A few people asked me why the festival seemed a bit smaller this year? The answer is that we experience what know many other village/school/fete organisers have faced since Covid: a lack of volunteers who would commit in advance to helping on a stall. We have a wide range of additional stalls that we could set up both days of the festival, but unless people commit in advance to helping on them, say for one hour on either day, we cannot erect the stall and make them available. As I say, this is not unique to the festival. I know most of the other local events have expressed the same issue over the past few years.

So, I wonder whether, as we are now fully out of



the pandemic and getting back to life, whether 2024 could be a turning point in charity volunteering? Many village organisations said to me that although they would have liked to have a stall at the festival, many of their number were now older, and that they could not find any volunteers to help. I also know several of the village groups are looking for additional volunteers to help run their weekly or monthly events. So, having been asked by a few village group leaders to ask, maybe this year, after the summer break you might wish to consider whether you could commit to help one of our village organisations with voluntary help and, if you'd like to see more stalls open at next year's festival. please drop email us festival@stdenys.org and we'd love to be in touch. Thank you.

Finally, I'd like to inform you that every 10 years or so, the Church of England require full-time clergy to have a three-month sabbatical from their day to day, 6-day a week ministry. This is to recharge the batteries, have a spiritual retreat and to focus on a period of study. For me, the latter will be looking at how rural parishes, like ours, have developed different congregations or ministries to reach people with little or no previous church contact, and to help them investigate the truths of the Christian faith and to make a commitment to follow Jesus in their daily lives. My sabbatical has been deferred three times for church, Covid and my hip op, and so the bishop was keen for me to take it this year. Although you will see me around the village, I shall therefore be away from I August to 31 October but during that time, there are clergy available to take services on Sundays, Funerals etc, and for any urgent pastoral need. The church wardens will oversee the day-to-day ruining of the church in my absence. I wish you all a healthy and relaxing summer and look forward to seeing many of you when we gather in November to remember those who put country before self, and we shall remember all service men and women who died in other wars and conflicts. Their service remains an inspiration to us all.

St Denys' Handbell Ringers


