# The Vicar Writes – February 2025 Dear Parishioners

One month of 2025 has already passed and I find myself reflecting on the changing world around us.

In our village, the rhythm of life may at times feel steady, marked by the seasons and the familiar faces we see in the COOP or at the school gate. Yet beyond our peaceful surroundings, the world seems to be shifting in ways that can leave us feeling unsettled.

Wars continue to rage or, to be on a knife edge in distant lands, bringing heartache to millions. A new President of the United States assumed office on January 20th and with that comes a swirl of opinions, promises, and uncertainties about what lies ahead for the global stage.

Closer to home, the rising cost of living, evidence of climate challenges, and other pressures remind us that none of us is untouched by the uncertainties of life.

In moments like these, it is natural to feel a sense of unease. We long for certainty, for peace, for a world that feels secure. But for Christians, we are reminded that our ultimate hope is not rooted in the ever-changing landscape of global politics, economics, or even our own circumstances. 

#### Gardening Tips for February

- Prepare vegetable seed beds and sow some vegetables under cover.
- Chit potato tubers, especially earlies.
- Protect blossom on Peaches, nectarines and apricots.
- Net fruit and vegetable crops to keep the birds off.
- Prune winter flowering shrubs that have finished flowering.
- Prune Wisteria.
- Renovate overgrown hedges with pruning
