The Vicar Writes – March 2025 Dear Parishioners

As the days begin to lengthen and the first signs of Spring emerge, we enter the season of Lent, a time of reflection, renewal, and preparation. But what is Lent really about? Why do Christians observe it, and how can it deepen faith?

Lent is a 40-day journey leading up to Easter, mirroring the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness, fasting, and resisting temptation. It's a season of spiritual discipline, a time to pause and consider our relationship with God. Traditionally, it has been marked by prayer, fasting, and almsgiving practices designed to draw us closer to God, to remind us of our dependence on Him, and to encourage us to live with greater compassion.

One of the most familiar aspects of Lent is giving something up, perhaps chocolate, coffee, or social media. But the purpose of sacrifice is not merely selfdenial; it is to create space in our lives for God. When we step away from distractions, we can focus more clearly on prayer, scripture, and service to others. Instead of only giving things up, many Christians also take something on: committing to daily acts of



kindness, volunteering, or setting aside time for quiet reflection.

Lent is also a season of repentance, a word that can sometimes feel heavy or uncomfortable. But repentance simply means turning back to God, realigning our lives with His love and grace. It is not about guilt but about transformation, acknowledging where we have strayed and seeking a fresh start. We are reminded that God's mercy is endless, and His desire is always to restore and renew us.

At its heart, Lent is a journey toward Easter, toward the promise of resurrection and new life. As we walk this path may we use this season as an opportunity to grow in faith, to serve with love, and to rediscover the deep joy of God's presence in our lives.

As we journey through Lent, we're reminded that it is not just a time of solemnity but also of hope. The 40 days lead us to the celebration of Easter, where we rejoice in the resurrection of Jesus and the victory of life over death. Lent prepares us to fully embrace the joy of Easter by helping us to shed what hinders us and to embrace the new life Christ offers.

May this Lenten season be a time of deep spiritual growth for each of us. Let us use this time to draw closer to God, to renew our commitment to following Christ, and to share His love with the world. Together, as a parish family, let us walk this journey with faith, hope, and love, trusting that God will meet us and transform us along the way.

Prune bush and climbing roses



- Plant onion sets and shallots
- Plant summer flowering bulbs
- Lift and divide overgrown clumps of perennials
- Plant early potatoes
- Leave a few dandelions to flower to support early bees
- Start off dahlia tubers in pots or trays of moist, peat free compost

We have used the opportunity to develop all areas of development including maths – recording number with tally charts and making marks.
