Gardening Tips for May

- Watch out for late frosts and protect vulnerable plants
- Earth up potatoes
- Plant out summer bedding at the end of the month
- Water early and late to get most out of water and use recycled water where possible
- Check carefully for nesting birds before clipping hedges
- Lift and divide overcrowded clumps of daffodils and other spring flowering bulbs
- Watch out for viburnum beetle and lily beetle grubs and remove by hand
