### The Vicar Writes – January 2026

#### **"Putting Our Hand Into the Hand of God"**

Dear Parishioner

As we step into a brand-new year, I wonder how many of us approach January with a mixture of hope and hesitation.

The calendar may have turned its page, but much in life continues exactly as it was on 31 December - the challenges, the uncertainties, the unanswered questions. Yet there is something about the month of January that invites us to pause, take a breath, and ask ourselves how we want to walk into the days ahead.

At moments like these, my mind returns to a beautiful and much-loved piece of writing, quoted by King George VI during the dark days of 1939. You may well know it:

*"I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: 'Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown.' And he replied: 'Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way."*

These words from Minnie Louise Haskins' poem *The Gate of the Year* speak with remarkable freshness even today. They remind us that what we most need at the start of a new year is not a spotlight that reveals every twist and turn ahead, but a steady hand to hold. The Christian faith does not promise us a detailed map; instead, it offers us a companion - Christ Himself -who walks with us into all that is still unknown.

In our rural communities, we understand something of this. We cannot control the weather, the markets, the harvests, or the countless variables that shape our days. But we do know about trust - trusting the seasons, trusting the land, trusting that seeds planted in quiet soil will, in time, bear fruit. And perhaps this January, we are invited to that same quiet trust in God: not a loud or dramatic faith, but a steady one that shows itself in small, daily ways.

To "put our hand into the hand of God" is to begin the year with openness rather than fear. It is to say, "Lord, I don't know what this year will bring, but I am willing to walk with You through it." It is to believe that whatever joys or sorrows 2026 may hold, we do not face them alone.

My prayer for our parish this year is simple: that we would be people of hope. Hope not built on wishful thinking, but on the deep conviction that God is faithful, God is near, and God is already at work in the places we cannot yet see. Whether this year brings new opportunities, new challenges, or simply more of the

### Stanford Church Bell Ringers

Thank you to everyone that noticed the bell ringing during 2025 and especially to those that noticed the improving quality of ringing.

We have taught a number of new ringers since about 2021, just a few new people each year, and it has been great to witness their development and enjoyment of the art of bellringing.

As well as ringing bells at our own towns and villages, bell ringers often ring at other bell towers. It can be a very social activity.

In October, our district ringers organised an outing to the Cotswolds. A group of more than 20 ringers met up and rang at Bourton on the Hill, Blockley, Moreton in Marsh (where we also had a lovely pub lunch), Broadwell, Stow on the Wold and Burford. There was also the opportunity to take a look at the bells themselves at Blockley and a fantastic CCTV set-up allowed us to watch the bells above our heads as we rang at Burford.

At the beginning of December, one of our youngsters rang at Winchester Cathedral, welcomed by the local ringers while in the area for a family visit to the Christmas markets.

In November, at Stanford in the Vale, we welcomed ringers from Harwell and Drayton who visited as part of their outing to the Vale of the White Horse. In January we are expecting more visitors – the Gloucestershire Golden Oldies.

- Prune apple and pear trees (<https://www.rhs.org.uk/fruit/apples/pruning-made-easy>)
- Clean pots and greenhouses ready for spring.
- Check houseplants regularly to avoid drying out.
- Inspect stored tubers of dahlias, begonias and cannas for rot or drying out.
- Start forcing rhubarb.
- Keep putting out food and fresh water for birds.
- Cut off hellebore leaves at the base to discourage black spot and show off flowers.
