#### **The Vicar Writes –**

##### **The Many Faces of Love**

**Dear Parishioner**

February arrives trailing a faint scent of roses, chocolate, and mild panic. Card shops groan under the weight of pink envelopes, restaurants dust off their most romantic tablecloths, and many of us are reminded that Valentine's Day is coming whether we are ready or not. Some approach it with delight, others with dread, and quite a few with a quiet hope that nobody is keeping score.

St Valentine himself would probably find it all rather bewildering. The historical Valentine was not a purveyor of heart-shaped balloons but a priest who quietly and faithfully served others, even at great personal cost. He is remembered not for grand gestures but for commitment – the sort that keeps going when things are hard, inconvenient, or unpopular. Not exactly the stuff of romantic comedies.

One of the challenges with modern Valentine's Day is that it tends to focus on just one type of love: eros – the heady, heart-racing, butterflies-in-the-stomach kind. There is nothing wrong with eros. It's exciting, joyful, and occasionally makes us behave in ways we later find mildly embarrassing. It has its place. But it is not the only kind of love, nor is it the one that sustains relationships, families, churches, or communities over time.

The Bible talks about several kinds of love. There is philia – friendship love, the sort that shows up with a casserole or remembers your birthday without Facebook reminders. There is storge – the steady, often unnoticed love of family, built on years of shared life. And then there is agape – the long-suffering, faithful, dependable love that keeps its promises, sticks around when enthusiasm fades, and continues even when appreciation is in short supply.



### Gardening Tips for February

- Prepare vegetable seed beds and sow some vegetable seeds under cover.
- Chit early and maincrop seed potatoes.
- Protect blossom on Nectarines, Peaches and Apricots.
- Net fruit and vegetable crops to keep birds off.
- Prune winter flowering shrubs that have finished flowering.
- Divide bulbs such as snowdrops and replant in the green.
- Renovate overgrown hedges with pruning.
